Scholarship & Discovery MS4 Final Submission

Due: March 27, 2020 by 12:00 Noon

The goal of the Final Submission is to ensure that you have achieved mastery of scholarly communication via a structured abstract and e-poster. We would also like for you to reflect on the impact of your scholarly work, as well as to provide advice for future classes.

WHAT should you submit?

Please submit your completed S&D 4th year project.

>> If that project is not complete/not something you want to be evaluated by the S&D Team and Track Leaders, please choose a previously completed project for submission (i.e. SRP project, MS2 Block project, independent study projects).

*Note: Fentress & Arnold Fellows MUST submit their proposed Fentress & Arnold project.

WHAT is due?

1) Structured Abstract

This is a 500-word abstract that summarizes a project that you have done in S&D (either MS2 or MS4 work). Abstract headings will include traditional research subheadings or descriptions of innovations for those pursuing this type of work in Community Health, Global Health, Medical Education, or Healthcare Delivery Sciences. Your abstract will be reviewed by the S&D Steering Committee.

Based on the review of your abstract, you may be asked to make edits before it is printed in a proceedings booklet to be distributed at the Senior Scientific Session on May 13, 2020, even if you are not formally participating.

2) E-Poster

This can be an update of your e-poster from the MS2 Spring Block or a new e-poster based on your MS4 work. E-posters will be evaluated by the S&D Steering Committee for clarity, conciseness, use of figures, and overall flow and layout.

3) Reflection Survey

This is a series of short answer and multiple choice questions about your progress, lessons learned, and suggestions for improvement.

All components of the Final Submission are to be submitted via **Chalk & Wire**

WHEN is it due?

The due date is **Friday, March 27, 2020 by 12:00 Noon**. This date enables us to formally review the materials to ensure that everyone is on track to graduate.

How does this relate to SENIOR SCIENTIFIC?

You will indicate in your submission whether you plan to participate in the Senior Scientific Session (SSS) on May 13, 2020; your decision will enable us to plan SSS accordingly.

***Friendly reminder:** Participation in Senior Scientific is awarded with 100 units towards graduation.*

How is it EVALUATED?

The S&D Steering Committee will review the quality of your work to ensure it meets the expectations above. Please always keep in mind that your effort towards progress on your S&D project(s) is valued above materialized results.
