

## Dear Incoming Students,

I am delighted that you will be joining us at the Pritzker School of Medicine. We very much look forward to welcoming you to our campus in Hyde Park this August. By now you are certainly experiencing many emotions, beginning with excitement about these next steps. The past year-plus has presented many challenges for all of us, and as we continue to confront them together it is natural you may be nervous about all that comes with the start of medical school. However, let me assure you there are extensive support systems in place at Pritzker to make your transition to medical school smooth and your time here productive, enjoyable, and memorable.

You are joining the Pritzker community at a very exciting time, one of transition and opportunity. I am thrilled to share that Vineet Arora, MD, MAPP, will succeed Dr. Brukner as Pritzker's Dean for Medical Education effective July 1. Dr. Arora's focus on the learning environment for trainees and her longstanding commitment to equal opportunity in medicine make her eminently well-suited to meet our current moment. Dr. Arora joined the UChicago faculty in 2005 and is currently the Herbert T. Abelson Professor of Medicine, Assistant Dean for Scholarship and Discovery, Associate Chief Medical Officer for Clinical Learning Environment, and a Master of the Academy of Distinguished Medical Educators.

In addition to her pioneering work in medical education research, Dr. Arora holds a deep commitment to improving health equity. She has received NIH funding to study novel methods of using social media to expose minority youth to careers in medicine and also leads an NIH-funded study on improving mentor training for women and minority medical students at eight medical schools.

The other deans at Pritzker are just as committed to engaging in meaningful conversations with our faculty, collaborating on projects and initiatives with our staff, and listening to our student voices. These same faculty and staff will be here to guide you throughout your education, as will students in higher classes upholding Pritzker's rich tradition of peer mentorship and service.

I wish you the best of luck on your journey through medical education. Everyone at Pritzker is here to support you the entire way.
